



PHOTOGRAPHY AND FILMING IN SCHOOL

Since the General Data Protection Regulations came into force, all those over the age of 13 now have to give consent for some forms of images to be taken in school. The school still has the legal right to take photographs deemed essential for the education of students. However, consent now has to be given for the use of student images in promotional material.

It should be noted that, in relation to some events, a consequence of not giving consent may mean that the student is not easily able to take part in the event itself; this is especially true where photographs/video recordings of groups of students are required.

If, after giving consent, a student then does not want to be photographed/filmed, they should simply explain this at the relevant time to the appropriate member of staff.
