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Attendance

Our attendance figure is currently standing at 95.6%, (compared to 95.8% at this time last year). Our Persistent Absence (PA) figure stands at 9.3% (compared to a national average of 13%). I thank you as parents for your support with this. I cannot emphasise enough the fact that good attendance to school significantly correlates to success. I must also thank Mrs Jennings our Attendance Officer and Mrs Haskell our Education Welfare Officer for the sterling work that they do.
