

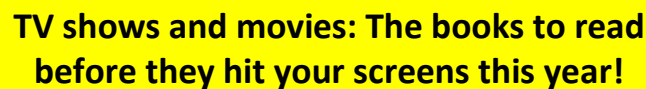

Book Trust, the reading agency for children has put together a roundup of all the books being made into films during 2023 and beyond. It includes John Green's *Turtles All The Way Down*; the prequel to The Hunger Games trilogy *The Ballad of Songbirds and Snakes*, and *Wonka*, a Netflix production starring Timothee Chalamet in a musical fantasy based on the infamous chocolateeer's early days before he opened his iconic factory. 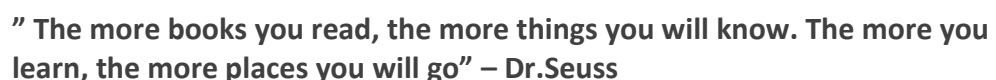

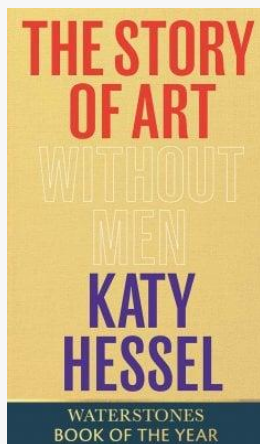

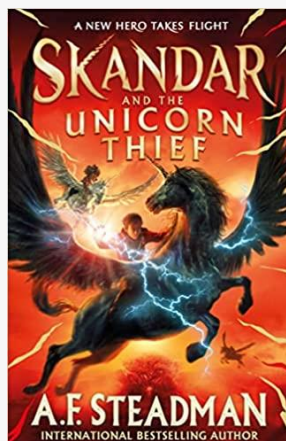


Waterstones Book of the Year



The Waterstones Book of the Year is an annual award presented to a book published in the previous 12 months. Waterstones booksellers nominate and vote to determine the winner for the prize. The 2022 winner is Katy Hessel with 'The story of Art without Men'. This book is a 500 year global survey of art by women such as Zanele Muholi and Tamara de Lempicka. It covers every substantial movement from the Dutch Golden Age in the 1600s to civil rights and antiracism in the 1900s and 2000s.

Children's Book of the Year



Calling all Harry Potter fans and Percy Jackson lovers! The 2022 Waterstones Children's Book of the Year is Skandar and the Unicorn Thief by A.F. Steadman. This book is about teenage boy Skandar who has only ever wanted to be a unicorn rider. But, as his dreams start to become reality, things take a dangerous turn. To make things worse, Skandar discovers a secret that could blow apart his world forever.

Holocaust Memorial Day

Holocaust Memorial Day is an international day on 27 January to remember the six million Jews murdered during the Holocaust, the millions of other people killed under Nazi persecution of other groups and in genocides that followed in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur.



This year's theme is Ordinary People – the ordinary people who let genocide happen, the ordinary people who actively perpetrated genocide, and the ordinary people who were persecuted. 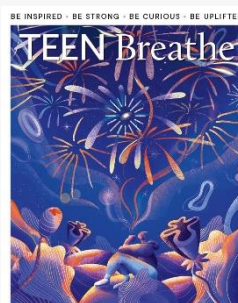
Did you know ...?

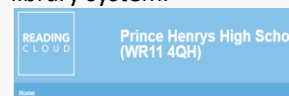
