CONFIRMATION and CLEARING

Results Day this year is Thursday August 13th. The school will be open from 9am onwards for A level results.

The importance of checking Track

Track (<https://trackucas.com>) will update you with the status of your application – it should be the first place you look. You will not get your actual A level results but your firm and insurance choices will have been indicated with 'conditional offer code' which will let you know whether or not you have got into your university choices. Once you have your results, Track will update to reflect the university decisions. **If Track shows a place is confirmed, it is not necessary to call UCAS.**

Top tips

To ensure the results and acceptance process runs smoothly we suggest you do plenty of research – there is a lot of information, and useful links in the Results section of the UCAS website: <https://www.ucas.com/undergraduate/results-confirmation-and-clearing/ucas-undergraduate-results>

Doing that all-important preparation will help you make the right decisions; prior to results day ensure you:

- understands the exact conditions of your offers, so you can make the right decisions when exam results are published.
- fully understands how you will receive your results. Exam results are not shown in Track, it will only show whether or not an application has been successful. If your qualification is NOT listed at <https://www.ucas.com/ucas/undergraduate/apply-and-track/results/sending-exam-results> you must send your results to the university or

college yourselves. You must not send you to UCAS, use the URL above for more information.

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Options when you get your results

If your grades are different to your original expectations, you can use UCAS Clearing. [Looking for a course in Clearing? Learn how Clearing works & find a new place \(ucas.com\)](#)

If your **exam results turn out to be better than expected** and not only meet, but exceed, the conditions of your conditional firm offer, you have the option to use Clearing to ‘trade up’ to a different course

Clearing can also be used if you have been **unsuccessful in gaining a place with either your firm or insurance choices.**

Even though you can’t approach a university for a Clearing place until you have your results and you have been made unsuccessful by the universities you applied to, it’s worth doing some research in advance to consider the types of courses that could be an option. Because you will deal directly with university admissions staff in Clearing, you should treat the process as a mini interview. Nothing can be gained from a speculative phone call with little or no understanding of the course or university, particularly during Clearing – it is still a competitive process and should be viewed as such.
